



Figure 1a. Five-Year Fall Enrollment Trend - 2017 to 2021





Figure 2a. Distribution of Traditional Undergraduate Fall Enrollment by Gender - 2017 to 2021

Figure 2b. Distribution of Total Fall Enrollment by Gender - 2017 to 2021






Figure 3a. Distribution of Traditional Undergraduate Fall Enrollment by Ethnicity - 2017 to 2021

Figure includes data for the largest three race/ethnicity subgroups.








Figure 4. Four- and Six-Year Graduation Rate Trends – Fall 2002 to Fall 2017 First-Time Full-Time Freshmen (FTFTF) Entry Cohorts (Add extra data points for FA15 to FA17 cohorts)


